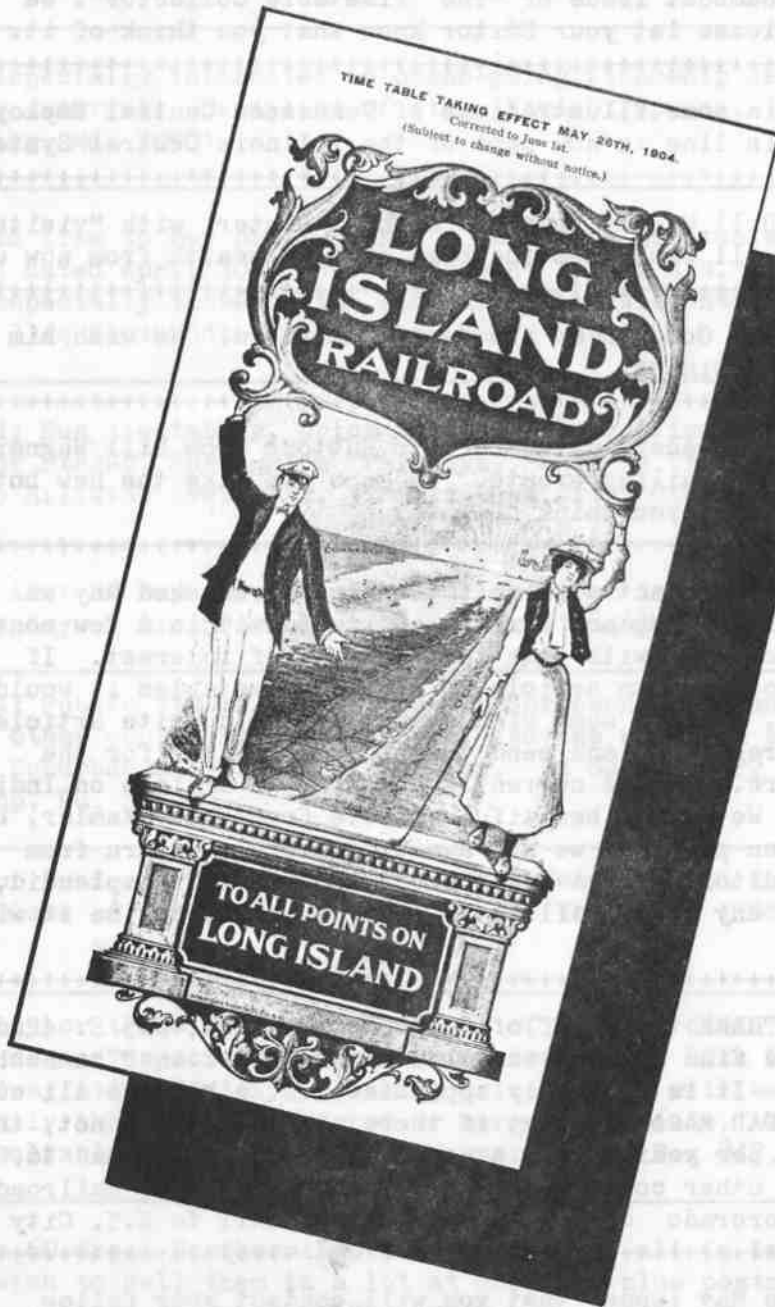

\*\*\* Steamer remains at Catskill until 6.00 a.m., connecting with early train for all points on the Catskill Mountain Railroad and the Catskill and Tannersville Railway. Passengers so desiring, however, may remain on board steamers, proceeding to Hudson, then transferring to steamer Isabella alongside (leaving Hudson 7.10 a.m.), returning on this boat to Catskill (without extra charge), in time to connect with the 8.20 a.m. train for all points on the Cairo Railroad, Catskill Mountain Railroad and the Catskill & Tannersville Railway, giving full night's rest and ample time for breakfast on board steamboats. Dining-room open from 5 to 9 a.m.

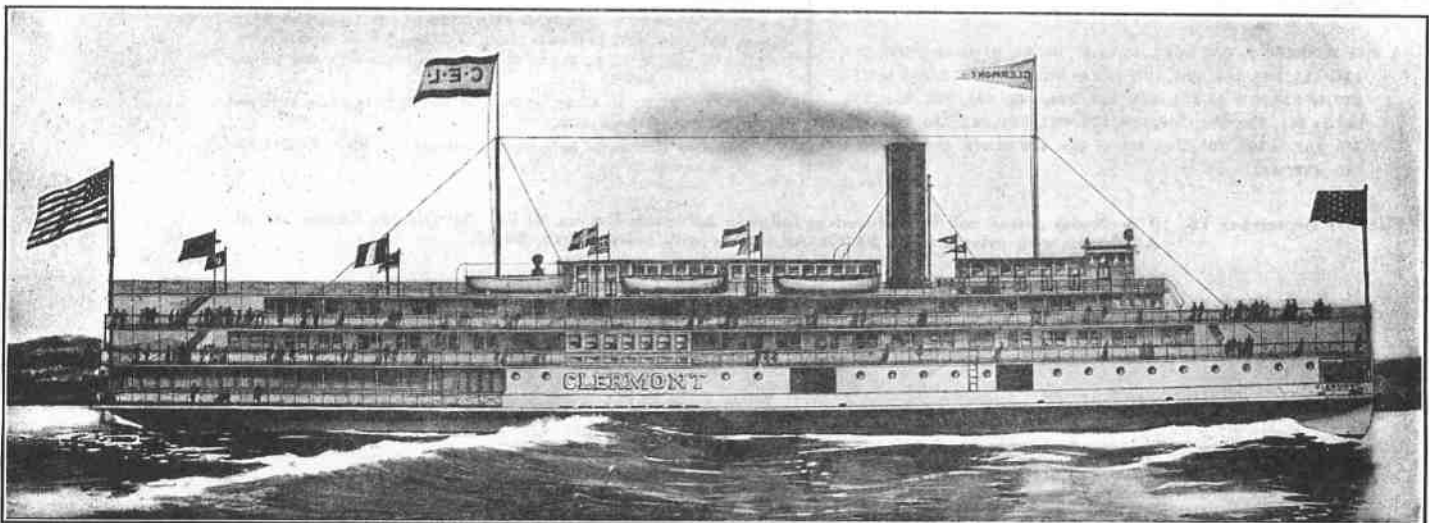

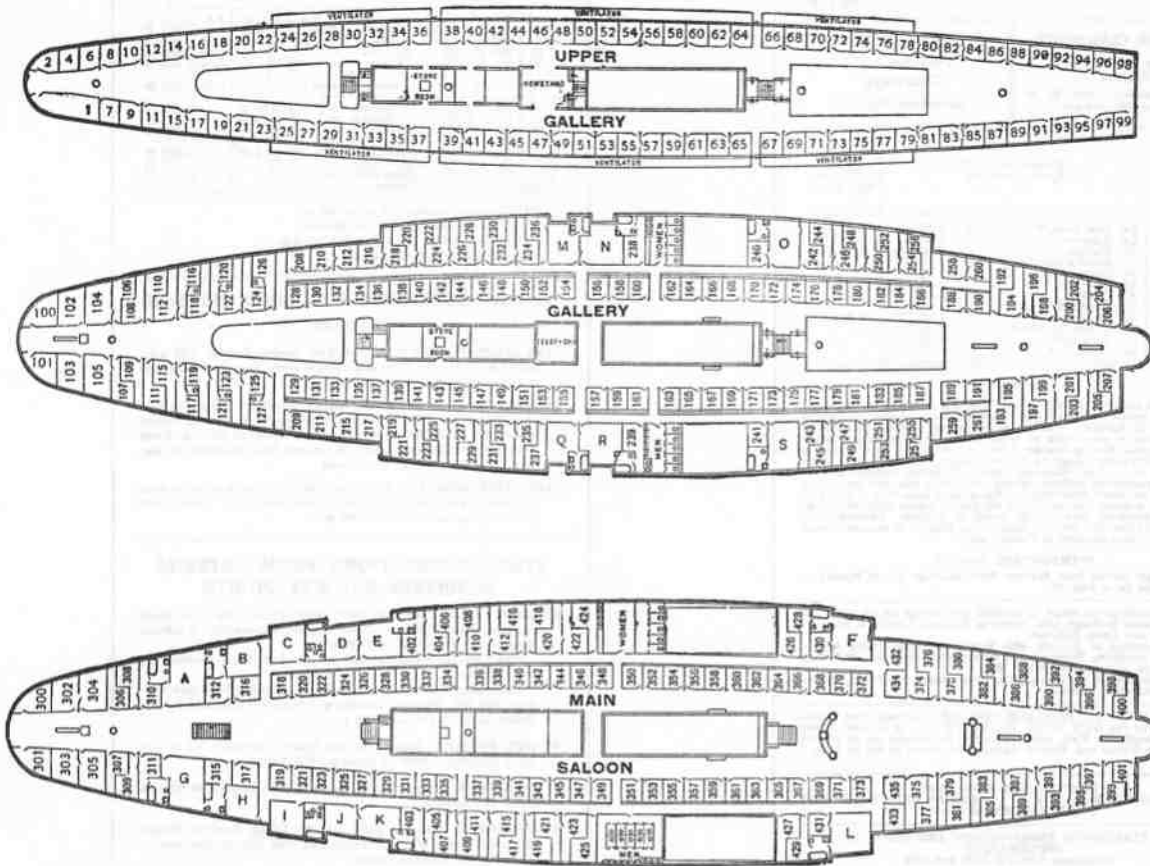
